



I think they need a little empathy. You've got to put yourself in their shoes. Maybe they had a tough day, or maybe they didn't know how to handle the situation.




That's a great point! Empathy helps us respond kindly instead of getting angry. But what if someone keeps being mean? Like, not passing the ball on purpose?

Hmm, well, that's where boundaries come in. You've got to be clear when something's not okay. You can say, "Hey, I don't like how that feels. Can we work together better?"




So, in short, successful relationships are about communication, empathy, and setting boundaries. Just like any good soccer team, you've got to work on these skills to improve.
